Stewardship Renewal	We are currently tracking about the same as last year regarding the number/percentage of people completing and submitting their stewardship forms. We do expect to receive some more in, and we encourage all who haven't yet done so, to do so as soon as possible.	
Lay Witness Talks	We had Lay witness talks the weekend of Nov. 19 th and 20 th . We had a great group of people who did a nice job sharing their lived experience with the parish. Thank you to all who helped with this.	
Rebuild My Church Campaign	Simpson Construction has been chosen for the remodel of the Church and other campus spaces. Three firms submitted proposals and were interviewed: Simpson, Hutton and Dondlinger. Any of the three would have been more than capable of doing the work, and it was not an easy selection to make. In the end, Simpson was the best fit.	Pat's details: Very good month and lots of stewards met pledges! 4.3 mil collected (about 72%)!! Plan is within 1-2 months sending out a statement to all pledges as a recap and follow up on where they all are at. As far as the building project, itself: the facilities council hired Simpson Co. and putting a timeline together. Construction docs should be done end of Feb. Construction would begin late spring. Would like to be able to have all church updates done by May 27 th so that Father Matt can say his first Mass in the Church. The rollout of the schedule and drawings to come soon and will be shared with the council as soon as we can. Questions: How long is construction? 4-6 months

Some of these people give a donation, however. There may be some who are in retirement homes/homebound may also not be able to participate in Stewardship.

About 2,400 were mailed. Pat understands we are working as hard as possible to put the information out there. 2,000 families who don't have kids in school.

Is it possible to send follow up email PDF that people can either complete online (a fillable PDF) or print the PDF and mail it. Sandi to work on this list – to get those who filled out forms for 2022, not 2023. At some point, we could look at 2019, did they not ever come back? (because of 2020 COVID year and/or other reasons)
