 one-on-one are key. Foster more relationships with our fellow parishioners – layperson to layperson communication, not just coming from Father. It's going to take us having those conversations with friends and family; many people aren't aware of the situation. Lay stewardship ministry leaders should lean into creating/leveraging stewardship opportunities for volunteers to get involved. Having more people involved should help increase tithing (overall). Town Hall style quarterly meetings where all parishioners are invited to hear the state of the parish and be able to discuss and ask questions. Make parish operations more accessible to everyone that way. Establishes a sense of ownership that may be missing for some folks (decision rights?, etc.). We need messages that address school parents, but then also need to reach people without kids in school. Remember who is in your audience. Talking primarily about school isn't the best approach for everyone or at least not talking about having your kids and grandkids in the school – that doesn't include all parishioners
 about having your kids and grandkids in the school – that doesn't include all parishioners. Tithing should be expected of everyone. Protestant churches are good at this.
 Increase focus on time and talent, with treasure to follow. If you've invested your time and talent, you

		 become aware of the needs and more likely to be generous. We need to better leverage skill sets within the parish (cut costs) at the same time as asking for more \$. Are there more ways to save in the budget by using volunteers? Are we missing any opportunities? For example, now more than ever we need the Parish Workday – perhaps multiple workdays with specific themes. Why can't we get this going? We could do multiple shifts during the day to entice more people to participate. Can't we ask for volunteers to lead these, in conjunction with our maintenance staff, rather than relying on one person like Pat? Communications could help with getting word out. People really respond favorably to these one-off opportunities.

2022 Renewal Numbers – Pat Burns reported that we are at 940 households that have turned in forms. A bit behind of last year, but in next couple of weeks should get in more forms. Tough to break through the 1,000 mark. 400 are school families and they will have Stewardship Forms. Most who don't return forms are non-school families. Some of these people give a donation, however. There may be some who are in retirement homes/homebound may also not be able to participate in Stewardship.

About 2,400 were mailed. Pat understands we are working as hard as possible to put the information out there. 2,000 families who don't have kids in school.
